MICHIGAN'S CHILD RESTRAINT LAWS HAVE CHANGED AS OF 4/2/25

SUMMARY OF CHANGES



Until children are at least 2 years old, they must ride in a rear-facing car seat

*It is safest to keep children rear-facing as long as possible to protect their neck and spine in a crash.



Until children are at least 5 years old, they must ride in a car seat with an internal five point harness



Until children are at least 8 years old, they must ride in a booster seat secured with a lap and shoulder seat belt



Until children are at least 13 years old, they must be restrained in the back seat.

*unless all back seats have other children in them
